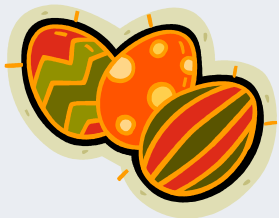

Neighborhood Concerns

- Raccoons can be a real nuisance for you and your neighbors when they get into your garbage cans. They leave smelly bags of garbage all over the ground around your garbage area. Please keep your cans secured tightly or keep your cans in the garage until the morning of garbage pickup. If the problem becomes too great, call Pinellas County and they will provide cages to trap the raccoons. They will pick up the trapped raccoons.

- Coyotes are highly adaptable animals that came to Florida decades ago and are able to survive on whatever food is available. In urban areas, coyotes can lose their fear of humans as a result of coming to rely on ample food sources including household refuse, pet food, or even intentional feeding of coyotes by residents. Coyote attacks on humans are very rare. Here are some solutions to remove the possibility of such attacks:
 1. Never feed a coyote or other wildlife--do not leave pet food or trash outside where it will attract wildlife.
 2. Clear brush and dense weeds from around dwellings.
 3. Do not leave young children unattended, even in a backyard.
 4. Protect pets--keep pets indoors, especially at night.
 5. Use negative reinforcement--Make sure the coyotes know that they are not welcome. Make loud noises, throw rocks or spray with a garden hose.
